01.04.04 Territorial Acknowledgement

J. Hennessy read the official territorial acknowledgment written by Elders and the Indigenous Advisory Circle as follows:

We would like to acknowledge that we are located within the territory of Mi'kma'ki, the unceded, ancestral territory of the Mi'kmaq. Our relationship and our privilege to live on this territory was agreed upon in the Peace and Friendship Treaties of 1752. Because of this treaty relationship it is to be acknowledged that we are all Treaty people and have a responsibility to respect this territory.

The Chair noted that what R. Inglis was about to present wasn't a fully-baked budget. We are projecting a deficit and budgeting for 700 new students. Hennessy thanked R. Rubin and everyone who contributed to the recent Library Renovation engagement sessions. He congratulated five faculty on being promoted to Professor: Dr. S. Andrews, Dr. I. Battioro, Dr. V. Meli, Dr. D. Thomas, and Dr. T. MacCormack, each of whom impressed the committee with their outstanding dossiers.

06.04.04 Presentation on Budget Development and Future Budget Planning

The budget supports strategic initiatives. There is a projected deficit of \$2m by April 30, and an expected deficit for next year's budget as well. The government grant base will be increased by 2%. If we increase our enrollment by 2%, they increase their grant amount by another 1.5%. In real numbers, a 2% enrollment increase translates to 47 new students (as measured on October 1). Tuition is projected to rise by 3%, which is consistent with other regional universities. There are no reductions to departmental budgets, and in some cases efforts are made to increase non-labour operating budgets. The provincial increase in minimum wage is built into the budget. The Provost noted that we secured government funding to (i) support the THRIVE foundation course initiative and (ii) upgrade recruitment software.
